ART CONNECT MONTHLY SESSIONS


The Art Connect project, supported by the City of Monash, offers a variety of engaging art sessions and workshops open to the public. These sessions are held on the **first Saturday of each month from 1:30 - 3 PM** in the Craft Room at the Mount Waverley Community Centre.





The April Art Connect Monthly Workshop showcased a captivating session on 'Gond Art.' led by member artist Pratibha Madan. Tailored specifically for beginners, the interactive workshop offered an immersive and insightful introduction to this vibrant traditional Indian art form. Participants delved into fundamental techniques crafted their and stunning Gond paintings featuring intricate bird motifs. Under Pratibha's skilled guidance, participants learned to master delicate patterns and distinctive detailing, deepening their appreciation for this unique artistic style. The enriching both educational session was creatively inspiring.

The May Art Connect Monthly Workshop showcased a captivating session on 'Kolam Art,' guided by talented member artist Shoba Iyer. This workshop offered a glimpse into the vibrant tradition of Kolam—a decorative floor art from Southern India. Traditionally crafted with rice flour, participants explored Kolam using contemporary materials, making it enjoyable and approachable for all skill levels. Participants learned the basics of dot Kolam, deepening their appreciation for its intricate beauty. The session was both enriching and inspiring, nurturing creativity while celebrating this timeless cultural heritage.





The June Art Connect session included a fun and hands-on 'Watercolour Landscape' workshop facilitated by our member artist Gopinath lyer. Participants learned basic watercolour techniques and practiced working with light and shadow. The event had a great turnout, with everyone excited to improve their painting skills in a friendly and supportive setting. The workshop was a success, leaving attendees inspired and eager for more.
